
The Future: Continuous Auditing and Beyond



- CBSE Sensex declined 188.50 points or 0.25 per cent to settle at 74,482.78.


JUNE HIGHLIGHTS

Domestic Institutional Investors contributed an additional INR 20,002 cr during the same period





Retail investors purchased stocks worth INR 21,179 cr on Election Day alone

The IT sector performed robustly, driven by strong quarterly earnings and positive guidance from major players like TCS and Infosys. The banking sector showed mixed performance, while the metals sector was under pressure due to fluctuating global metal prices and subdued demand


The grey cloud comes out, And the thunder is rumbling. Everything seems so dark, And yet so brightening.




