

Chairman's Communique... Continues...

ADMINISTRATION AND INFRASTRUCTURE

Many administrative measures were implemented in order to improve the services to members and students. Our aim was to provide complete satisfaction to the members and students. Few Physical and Technical Infrastructure developments were undertaken at SIRC. Capital Budgets of all the 45 branches were cleared for the infrastructure requirements of the branches. SIRC was in constant touch with the branches throughout the year in educating and guiding them on their various requirements. Majority of the branches submitted their yearly and half yearly financials well within the time. GST implementation at branch was continuously monitored. SIRC website was revamped. Dash board was introduced for members and students and all the CPE programs at SIRC is now registered online. We have completely stopped Cash Collections at SIRC. SIRC accounts both yearly and half yearly were submitted well within the time prescribed. Frequent meetings of EC enabled us to take corrective steps and also implement changes whenever it was required. On Analysing the calls received, we found almost 85% of the calls received at SIRC have been answered and we are working towards achieving 100%. Uniform was introduced for Class IV employees of SIRC.

FIRST AT ICAI

SIRC took an initiative to collect contributions to CABF. This is the first time any region or branch has taken this initiative in the history of ICAI. We started with a target to collect Rs. 1.00 Crore and I am happy to share with all of you, that we have collected contribution of around Rs. 1.40 Crores for the year 2017-18 and with a few more gracious contributors, we may even touch Rs. 1.50 Crores by the end of March, 2018. Sincere thanks from the bottom of my heart to all the contributors who graciously joined hands for this noble cause.

FIRST AT SIRC

During the year SIRC has achieved several milestones which are first of its kind by the region -

- 1. Introduction of Dash Board for Members and Students;
- 2. Achieving Zero Percent Pendency of documents received at members, firms and students section;
- 3. Conducted over 1,000 hours of CPE programs;
- 4. Conducted five Annual Regional Residential Courses;
- 5. Cycling, Mini Marathon and Walkathon were conducted at Nungambakkam on 01st July, 2017;
- 6. Eight important occasions were celebrated at the region;
- 7. 12 monthly workshops of 20 hours CPE were conducted;
- 8. For the First time the financials showed a surplus of 7 digits for the year ending 31.03.2017;
- 9. For the First time the financials showed a surplus of 7 digits for the half year ending 30.09.2017;
- 10. Concept of T+7 (Transactions plus 7 days), wherein any document received in SIRC should be cleared within 7 days were introduced;
- 11. Webcasting of Crash Courses, Couching Classes to branches;
- 12. Video conferencing with all the 45 branches and staff training of all the branches using technology:
- 13. Document Received Status is communicated from members and firms section through SMS;
- 14. Distributing bags to CA students attending coaching classes;
- 15. Canteen facilities started for the benefit of students.

- 1. Open the OR Code reader on your phone.
- 2. Hold your device over a QR Code so that it's clearly visible within your smartphone's screen.



Two things can happen when you correctly hold your smartphone over a QR Code.

- 1. The phone automatically scans the code.
- 2. On some readers, you have to press a button to snap a picture, not unlike the button on your smartphone camera.
- 3. If necessary, press the button.

Your smartphone reads the code and navigates to the intended destination, which doesn't happen instantly. It may take a few seconds on most devices.

ANNOUNCEMENT

22nd January 2018

Clarifications on the announcement dated 9th January 2018 on "Exemptions(s) from appearing in a paper(s) or Group of CA exams under the New Scheme of Education and Training w.e.f May 2018 examinations"

It is seen that queries are being raised whether a candidate who has passed one of the Groups of either Intermediate or Final exam under the Existing Scheme is required to convert compulsorily from the Old Scheme to the New Scheme, so as to appear in the examinations to be held from May/June 2018 onwards.

It is clarified that the announcement dated 9th January 2018 in respect of "Exemptions(s) from appearing in a paper(s) or Group of CA exams under the New Scheme of Education and Training w.e.f May 2018 examinations" deals with transition provisions applicable to those who convert from the Old Scheme to the New Scheme.

In this connection, it is hereby further clarified as follows:

- 1. Students have the option of continuing in the Existing Scheme or to convert to the New Scheme. It is not mandatory to convert from the Old Scheme to the New Scheme so as to be eligible to appear in May
- 2. Students registered under the Old Scheme can continue to appear in the exam under the Old Scheme, in the normal course till such time the exams under the Old Scheme are being held.
- 3. Students registered under the New Scheme will be required to apply and appear in the exams to be held under the New Scheme from May 2018 onwards
- 4. Students converted from the Old Scheme to New Scheme will be required to apply for and appear in the exams to be held under the New Scheme from May 2018 onwards.
- 5. Exams under the New Scheme will be held at all levels from May 2018 onwards.
- 6. Exams under the old Scheme will continue to be held as per the Implementation schedule of Revised Scheme of Education and Training contained in Announcement dated 1st July 2017, of Board of Studies hosted on www.icai.org at Students>Board of Studies Announcements Section.
- 7. It is hereby clarified that the last exam under the Old Scheme for different levels will be held as follows:

Common Proficiency Test June 2019 Intermediate (IPC)-Old Scheme May 2019 Final (Old) Scheme November 2020

In this connection, students are advised to go through the Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs) in respect of Revised Scheme of Education and Training (Question No 36 to Question No 43)

hosted by the Board of Studies in this regard at www.icai.org in the FAOs>students section.

For any further clarifications, candidates are advised to write to the Exam Dept, at the following e-mail IDs:
