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





He is also a member of various committees of SEBI and the capital markets like Risk Management Review Committee, FPI advisory committee etc.

He is a graduate from Mumbai University and a Member of the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India.

I am Nithin, and I founded Zerodha. I love trading (although not actively anymore) and capital markets. At Zerodha, we focus on building the best tools and services for traders and investors in India. Alongside Zerodha, I also help startups through our Rainmatter fintech fund and more recently, have setup the Rainmatter Foundation to give back to the society, the success we have had at Zerodha.

Apart from work, I particularly enjoy playing guitar and singing along with my son Kiaan who plays drums, working out with my wife, Seema, spending time with my biological brother Nik (Nikhil) and my brothersfrom-other-mothers K (Kailash), Venu, Karthik, Hanan, and our families. I love running, cycling, and swimming in nature, playing basketball and poker, and enjoy all genres of music.

In school, I was a below average student academically. I discovered trading and the markets by accident at the age of 17. I've been through the boom and bust journey every good trader experiences. In the early 2000s, I borrowed money and blew up my trading account and then worked in a call center for 4 years trying to make up for the debt, while also trading on the side. I met Seema while working there. I quit my job when I met the first person who asked me to manage their portfolio.

I became a franchisee of Reliance Money (brokerage firm) to start a formal advisory business. Around this time, Nik, who is a much better trader than I am, joined me. With him trading, we figured I could set aside some time building a brokerage firm that we felt we needed as traders. As we were figuring this out, we came across NOW, a free trading platform that NSE was offering to brokers. Finally, in 2010, we hustled and pulled together just enough money to start Zerodha. Venu, who had been our friend for a long time, and was working with us since our Reliance Money times, handled operations. Hanan, who had been trading with us, started taking care of support. We started out as a small team, had no pedigree education, no background in tech, no experience, but had a passion for capital markets and the intent to help other traders like us.As a Reliance Money franchisee

With Zerodha, we were the first to introduce a flat fee model (a maximum of ₹20 per trade), helping traders save upto ~90% of brokerage charges compared to the exorbitant percentage fees which was common at the time. In addition, we offered this single pricing plan to all our clients unlike the then incumbent players who had opaque offerings for different groups of clients. While we started from zero, this transparency slowly got us attention on online communities and via word of mouth.

However, our fintech journey really started when K joined us in 2013 and we started our tech team. We should ideally be called FinKech :) Our still tiny tech team continues to build products which are unmatched, not just in the Indian brokerage industry, but internationally as well.

Nik continued to do what he does best, trade and take care of risk management. He has now set up a very successful hedge fund called True Beacon.

Karthik joined us in 2014 and wrote Varsity single handedly, which is now among the top capital market education initiatives in the world.







Prakash my first customer, Austin who helped Zerodha get started, Om and Bharat our CAs, Seema, and my parents who have always supported my life decisions, have been key in this journey.

I have a team of young boys and girls, the Z team, with whom I spend a lot of time at work. We discuss, debate, and ideate everything business and fun. And behind the scenes, our ~1100 member strong team runs various parts of Zerodha.

Today, Zerodha is the largest retail brokerage firm in India by all measures, and one of the largest retail trading platforms in the world by activity. We have achieved this without ever advertising, or raising any external capital or debt. We focused on innovative products and services, and it took us a slow and steady 10 years along with a lot of luck.

It isn't about the big beating the small anymore, but the fast beating the slow, as we have proven. Having a nimble organisational structure focused on creating value for customers without chasing revenue, growth, or valuations, is our big moat, our secret sauce. This sounds counterintuitive and goes against what is taught to entrepreneurs today who are constantly pushed to continuously raise capital, and to measure success and growth in terms of notional valuation and meaningless growth metrics, instead of creating businesses that are profitable and sustainable.

After the success of Zerodha, and more recently, the media bestowing on us glamourised labels like "unicorn" and "billionaires", I felt I should share my personal perspective on business and life, and what success really means to me, beyond the labels. If nothing else, I want to tell people that it is possible to be successful at business by questioning the true cost of revenue, valuations, and growth, instead of continuously chasing them. And that success is relative, impermanent, and a lot of luck too.

Lately, I have been sharing my views through podcasts, social media, and blog posts. This website is a collection of my musings, the insights I've gained and I want to share, especially for those building businesses and trading the markets.

The Journey of My Life

I was born on August 03, 1948, in Siddaramana Hundi of Varuna Hobli in Mysore district. My family was mainly dependent on agriculture. In the days when getting through matriculation itself was a tough proposition, I was the first graduate in the family.

Childhood and Education

I spent my childhood days in Siddaramana Hundi. I was forced to discontinue my education for some time due to difficult circumstances at home and because of which I was asked to tend the cattle. But the teachers of my village school recognized my interest towards studies helped me to directly get admitted to IV standard.

After my primary and secondary education, I went to Mysore for my college education. I secured admission in Yuvaraja's College in Mysore and obtained my B.Sc. degree. My father wanted me to become a doctor, but I chose a different path. However, destiny had other plans as I went on to follow my own dreams and pursue law. After obtaining a degree in law from Sharada Vilas College, I served as a guest lecturer at Vidyavardhak College.

A life of struggle

Even after beginning to practice law, I did not completely dedicate myself in the courts. My mind was always concerned about the hardships of the exploited classes and that was when I came under the influence of socialist thinker Dr. Ram Manohar Lohia. As a student, I lived a tough life in a rented room in Mysore. The hardships of those times gave me a deep perspective and have now helped in formulating several schemes for the welfare of the poor and downtrodden.

'I know what trials and tribulations the poor face. I have myself experienced those difficulties. That is why I introduced schemes like Anna Bhagya (providing food grains to the poor for free or at subsidized prices), Ksheera Bhagya (providing milk) and Vidyasiri (providing assistance for education)'.

Foray into Politics

After starting legal practice with Prof. P.M. Chikkaboraiah, I gradually entered public life and started taking lead to fight against social evils. My quest for social justice through reforms made me quit legal practice and jump into politics. I started taking one small step at a time in politics and started gathering momentum. My political life began in 1978 when I became a member of Taluk Development Board. I was also simultaneously attracted to the farmers' movement and thus began my association with Prof. M.D. Nanjundaswamy, who pioneered farmers' struggle in Karnataka.







My entry to electoral politics was through Lok Sabha elections from Mysore in 1980. Though I did not win the election but I was determined to continue my fight. I considered this defeat as a stepping stone to victory when I contested from the Chamundeshwari seat in the 1983 assembly elections in the state as a candidate of Lok Dal. Contesting with the symbol of a scale, I won against D. Jayadevaraja Urs of Indira Congress and entered the legislative assembly. The role of Shri. Kempaveeraiah, a leader of Mysore taluk, was crucial in this victory.

When I entered the legislative assembly, Shri Ramakrishna Hegde's government was in office. Hegde had taken the support of BJP and independents to form the government, and even I had extended my support to the government. I was then made the Chairman of Kannada Watchdog Committee. When midterm elections took place for the legislative assembly, I contested as a candidate of Janata Party and was re-elected. I then became a minister for Animal Husbandry and Sericulture. I was Transport Minister in the cabinet of Shri. S.R. Bommai. In 1989, Janata Party split into two as Janata Dal and Samajawadi Janata Party. I identified myself with Janata Dal but lost in the subsequent assembly elections. In 1991, I contested in the Lok Sabha elections from the Koppal constituency and lost. Those were the days when I had more time for fighting against issues other than administrative work.

Recognition

Undeterred by electoral failures, I again contested in the 1994 legislative assembly election as a Janata Dal candidate where I won and entered the assembly for the third time. I became the Finance Minister in the cabinet of Shri H.D. Deve Gowda. When I was preparing the first budget as the Finance Minister, there were gibes like 'what does a shepherd know about finance?' But I did not pay heed to such insults. Instead, I took it as a challenge and later presented thirteen budgets which were hailed by eminent economists. When in 1996 Shri Deve Gowda became the Prime Minister, I became the Deputy Chief Minister in Shri. J.H. Patel's cabinet.

In 1999, Janata Dal split again. I identified myself with Janata Dal (Secular). I lost the subsequent assembly election and only to win in 2004 assembly election and became Deputy Chief Minister in the Congress-JD(S) coalition government.

Due to altered political circumstances, I was expelled from JD(S). I lost the opportunity to become Chief Minister because of the maneuvers of unseen hands. I spearheaded AHINDA (Kannada acronym for minorities, backward classes and Dalits) conventions in various places of Karnataka to hear their concerns and be their voice. It was always felt that minorities, backward classes and Dalits were marginalized and not given their due opportunity. I wanted to ensure social justice in all political and administrative platforms.

Turning Point

After coming out of JD(S), I joined the Congress Party in the presence of AICC President Smt. Sonia Gandhi at a huge rally held at Palace Grounds in Bangalore on July 22, 2006. This was another turning point in my political path. Later, I contested in the by-election to the legislative assembly from Chamundeshwari constituency and won. In 2008, when the assembly constituencies were reorganized, a new constituency of Varuna came into being.







I entered the legislative assembly from this new constituency. I then became the leader of the opposition. At this juncture, I took on the mining barons of Bellary and led an historical foot march 'Bellary Padayatra' from Bangalore to Bellary and exposed the corruption of Bharatiya Janatha Party. This turned out to a great success in terms of reaching out to people and letting them understand the corrupt practices of Bharatiya Janatha Party. This latter generated lot of voice in various public forums.

Towards the seat of Chief Minister

In the elections held to the assembly in 2013, I traveled the length and breadth of Karnataka and ensured the grand victory of his party.

First Official Order

When I took oath as the Chief Minister of Karnataka, I was determined that our government would deliver on all the promises made to the people during elections. I decided that the election manifesto of the party should not remain a mere document, but should be the guiding light of our government. Thus immediately after swearing in as the Chief Minister, I announced several welfare programs for the poor, underprivileged and minorities, most prominently, Anna Bhagya.

In my very first budget, I fulfilled 60 out of 165 promises made in the election manifesto. In the second budget, another 30 promises were fulfilled. By the end of fifth year, all the promises were fulfilled. The schemes and policies, during my tenure, have provided relief to all sections of our society and has helped everyone to improve their standard of living. I always wanted to dedicate my work for the welfare of the poor and the marginalized and I am confident that I have succeeded in it.

As Leader of Opposition

Multiple factors led to the formation of Indian National Congress – Janatha Dal (Secular) coalition government after 2018 Karnataka Assembly Elections. I was chosen as the leader of coordination committee and we tried a lot to safeguard the government. Unfortunately, the unethical political game plan of BJP succeeded in ending the coalition government.

I was chosen as the leader of opposition and leader of Congress legislature party in Karnataka assembly. Our fight continued to expose the failures of BJP and ensure justice to Kannadigas. We fought extensively to highlight the 40% corruption, covid scam, recruitment scams, etc.

We finally succeeded in putting a break to miserable governance of BJP by winning 136 seats in the 2023 Assembly Elections.

Chief Minister of Karnataka 2.0

I will continue to relentlessly work to ensure justice to every Kannadiga and uphold the pride of Karnataka. We are committed to implement our guarantees and give the best for our state.







Daily this Institute condu0cts 100-125 Angiogram Procedures including Angioplasties, 25 Open Heart Surgeries, 600-700 Echocardiography tests and attends Out patients of 1500-1700. To accommodate this huge volume without diluting the quality of care, additional Out Patient Blocks are constructed and laboratory services are extended and even we have introduced appointments to Out Patient Services through SMS.







The top priority is given to cleanliness and hygiene at all levels of services and most patients and visitors wonder stuck and they won't believe that this is a Government run hospital. Today we have shown that the Government run autonomous institute can be managed like a **Five Star Hospital** which most people think it is next to impossible and we have brought in a corporate work culture with very good public relation and guest relation system.

We have introduced Incentive Scheme for all employees based on performance, productivity and punctuality which has resulted in greater motivation and higher productivity. We have encouraged public private partnership in providing Cardiac MRI Services. 

RERA – Host of Opportunities for Professionals

The Real Estate (Regulation and Development) Act, commonly known as the RERA Act, was enacted by the Parliament of India in 2016. This legislation was introduced to address various issues in the real estate sector, including delays in project completion, lack of transparency, and unfair practices.

RERA has not only redefined the real estate landscape in India but also opened up a myriad of opportunities for professionals across various sectors. Allottees (home buyers) - RERA aims to create a fair and transparent real estate sector by clearly defining the rights and responsibilities of allottees, thereby ensuring their protection and fostering trust between allottees and promoters – Refer Section 19
Authorities and Appellate – RERA being the regulatory authority for the Real Estate Industry, the Act has a provision to appoint the Authority and the Appellate (consisting of 1 Chairperson and minimum 2 members) to administer and also hear the complaints of the Aggrieved parties.	Bankers and Lenders - Their involvement is crucial for maintaining financial discipline and stability within the real estate sector. RERA includes provisions requiring that funds collected from allottees be deposited in a separate bank account, which must be used exclusively for that specific project. Bankers and lenders play a vital role in this process by ensuring the release of funds only after obtaining the necessary certificates from the relevant professionals

Small Businesses, Big Impact

How SMEs are turning the wheels of India's economy

India, with its vast and diverse economy, has always been a fertile ground for entrepreneurship. Amidst the towering giants of industry, small businesses hold a unique and indispensable position. These enterprises, often rooted in local communities and traditions, form the bedrock of the Indian economy.

According to the Annual MSME report 2023, there are about 6.3 crore MSMEs in the country, contributing approximately 30% to the GDP. According to a CRISIL report in 2023, the MSME sector's debt requirement was estimated at more than Rs 100 lakh crore, with around 70% needed for working capital. However, only a fourth of the debt was sourced formally. This is set to change. Enabling digital credit access to MSMEs has been a major focus for the DPI, with participation from financial institutions. Its components—Aadhaar products such as e-authentication and e-KYC owned by the Unique ID Authority of India (UIDAI), eSign maintained by the Ministry of Communications and Information Technology, DigiLocker owned by the Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology, UPI owned by the RBI—are all game changers.

Business Incidental relating to Charitable or Religious Trust or Institution

1. Brief introduction

The controversy revolves in dealing with 'incidental to business, by charitable or religious trust or institution'. There is a tendency to treat incidental to business as a business by the tax department. The changes made by the Finance Act, 2008 by inserting proviso to section 2(15) of IT Act, 1961 has far reaching impact. The Supreme Court judgement in case of CIT v. Ahmedabad urban development Authority (2022) 449 ITR 001 has brought clarity as to the circumstances in which proviso to section 2(15) applies. The Judgement of the Supreme Court in case of New Noble Educational Society v/s. Chief CIT and another (2022) 448 ITR 0594 has far reaching impact in dealing with 'incidental to business'. In case of educational institutions fees collected for providing uniform, catering facilities, van facilities, and supply of textbooks, and in case of hospital running pharmacy whether amounts to 'business incidental'?

Section 11(4A) of the IT Act, 1961 enables charitable or religious trusts or institutions to carry on business incidental to their main objects.

2. Prerequisite conditions to claim exemption u/s 11

The charitable trust or institution in order to claim exemption u/s 11, the following condition to be satisfied as required u/s 11(4A).

The business undertaken is incidental to the main objects of the trust or institution, and

Separate books of accounts have to be maintained for such business.

3. Meaning and importance of the word 'incidental to the main objective'

Section 11(4A) provides a condition that the profits and gains of the business unless is incidental to the attainment of the objectives of the trust, section 11(4A) will not apply. What is the meaning of the expression 'incidental'? The word 'incidental' is not defined in the I T Act, 1961. In common parlance, this expression is used to denote as ancillary or supportive. Ancillary or supportive to the attainment of main objects. This has a character to sub-serve the dominant object which is termed as 'incidental'.

The expression 'incidental purposes' arises when there is dominant purpose for which the trust or institution is constituted. These incidental purposes acts as push and pull and supportive for the main organ of the dominant purpose.

While considering "incidental to the main objects", the emphasis is whether the activity was so inextricably connected or linked with the object of the trust and it could be considered as incidental to those objectives. For example, trust promoting education even if it was engaged in publication of school books would amount to incidental business and section 11(4A) will apply [Gujarat state board of school Textbooks v. Asst. CIT, Gandhinagar circle (2016) 75 taxmann.com 281 (Guj)].

4. Nexus between dominant and incidental objects

The expression 'incidental to the attainment of the objectives' demonstrates that there must be nexus between activity undertaken and the objects. Thereby, there exists nexus between dominant and incidental objects to claim exemption u/s ll(4A). In the undernoted case, there was no nexus







between the activities relating to running of "community hall" and the objects of the assessee. Under the circumstances, it was held that the assessee cannot be entitled to exemption u/s 11 - Dy. CIT v. Chennai Kammavar Trust (2017) 156 TR (A) 235 (Chen-Trib).

The Supreme Court in New Noble Educational Society noted *supra* observed that "This reasoning equally applies especially in section 11(4A) which speaks of profits incidental which specifies that exemption in relation to income or trust of an institution which are profits or means of business cannot be exempted 'unless the business is incidental, trust or as the case may be institution and separate books of accounts are maintained by such trusts or institution in respect of such business'. Thus, the underlying objective of seventh proviso to section10(23C) and of section 11(4A) are identical. These have to be read in the light of the main provision which spells out the conditions for exemption u/s 10(23C), the same conditions would apply equally to the other sub clauses of section 10(23C) that deal with education, medical institution, hospitals etc".

5. Judicial Analysis

The Supreme Court in case of New Noble Educational society vs. Chief CIT and another (2022) 448 ITR 0594, has dealt with the issue of 'business incidental' in relation to educational. The observation of the court is as follows:

'What then is 'incidental' business activity in relation to education? Imparting education through schools, colleges and other such institutions would be per se charity. Apart from that there could be activities incidental to providing education. One example is of text books. This court in a previous ruling in Assam state text book production & publication Corporation Ltd., v. CIT (2009) 17 SCC 391 has held that dealing in text books is part of a larger educational activity. The court was concerned with state established institutions that published and sold text books. It was held that if an institution facilitated learning of its pupils by sourcing and providing text books, such activity would be incidental to education. Similarly, if a school or other educational institution ran its own buses and provided bus facilities to transport children, that too would be an activity incidental to education. There can be similar instances such as providing summer camps for pupils' special educational courses, such as relating to computers etc., which may benefit its pupils in their pursuit of learning'.

However, where institutions provide their premises or infrastructure to other entities, trusts, societies, etc., for the purposes of conducting workshops, seminars or even educational courses (which the concerned trust is not actually imparting) and outsiders are permitted to enrol in such seminars, workshops, courses, etc., then the income derived from such activity cannot be characterised as part of education or 'incidental' to the imparting education. Such income can properly fall under the other heads of income as held by the Supreme Court noted *supra*.

Providing hostel facilities to the students

In R R M Educational Society held providing hostel facilities to pupils would be an activity incidental to imparting education. If the institution provided hostel and allied facilities (such as catering etc) only to its students, that activity would clearly be 'incidental' to the objective of imparting education.

The decision of Apex Court is clear that the activity pursued which has the character of business and have nexus to the main object. If this test fails then it does not constitute 'Incidental'. That is why in case of trust conducting workshops, seminar or educational courses and outsiders are permitted to enrol in such seminars, workshops, courses etc., then income derived from such activity cannot be characterised as part of educational or 'incidental' to imparting education.







However, in case of CIT v. Thanthi Trust (2002) 247 ITR 785(SC) where the Supreme Court held "A business whose income is utilized by the trust or the institution for the purposes of achieving the objectives of the trust or the institution is surely, a business which is incidental to the attainment of the objectives of the trust".

6. Maintenance of separate books of accounts

Section 11(4A) explicitly makes it clear that the separate books of accounts have to be maintained when the trust or institution derives income being profits and gains which are incidental to the main object of clarity. Rule 6F to the I T Rules, 1962 prescribes books of accounts and documents to be maintained.

7. Distinction between business held under trust [section 11(4)] and trust carrying on business [section 11(4A)]

The Supreme Court in case of Ahmedabad urban development Authority (2022) 449 ITR 1, has drawn distinction between section 11(4) and 11(4A) of I T Act, 1961. Which are as follows:

"Section 11(4) applies to cases where the business undertaking itself is the property held by a trust. Thus, where the property held in trust, or where property settled by the donor or trust creator in favour of the trustees itself is a business undertaking, then the income from such an undertaking is covered by section 11(4). Section 11(4A) operates differently. It is applicable to cases where the trust carries on a business. Section 11(4A) states that when a trust carries on a business, unless the business is incidental or ancillary to the attainments of the objectives of the trust, it would be disentitled to an exemption u/s 11(1). It imposes a further condition that separate books of accounts need to be maintained in such cases.

Section 11(1) confers an exemption from tax only where the property itself is held under a trust or other legal obligation. It does not apply to cases where a trust or legal obligation is not created on any property, but only the income derived from any particular property or source is set apart and charged for a charitable or religious purpose. Similarly, when a business itself has been set aside for the objects of the trust, then such business is held under trust and will fall under sub-section (4). However, where the profits of a business of a trust are applied for charitable purposes, then such business and trust will be governed by sub-section (4A).

Section 11(1) of the act exempts income derived from property held under trust wholly for charitable or religious purposes, to the extent to which such income is applied to such purposes in India. The act does not comprehensively define "property held under trust". Section 11(4) however, provides that for the purposes of section 11, the words "property held under trust" "includes a business undertaking so held". Section 11(4A) as amended by the Finance (No. 2) Act, 1991 w.e.f. 1/4/1992 reads as under:

"(4A) Sub-section (1) or (2) or (3) or (3A) shall not apply in relation to any income of a trust or an institution, being profits and gains of business, unless the business is incidental to the attainment of the objectives of the trust or, as the case may be, institution, and separate books of account are maintained by such trust or institution in respect of such business".

In the case of CIT v. Mehta charitable Prajnalay Trust (2013) 357 ITR 560 (Del), section 11(4), the expression of property held under the trust includes business in which section 11(4) will apply. Section 11(4A) of the act would apply only to a case where the business is not held under trust.

CAs in the era of Artificial Intelligence

We live in the era of Artificial Intelligence; an era where the world's repository of information is accessible at the tip of one's fingertips, where asking questions is more important than providing answers and where knowledge is less relevant than curiosity. In a remarkably short span of time, the means of human-computer interactions have dramatically changed. The types of jobs most susceptible to automation and replacement by Artificial Intelligence are jobs that are:

- 1. rule based
- 2. Repetitive
- 3. Based on vast amounts of data analysis
- 4. Based upon prior works and prior decisions

The above criteria describe the vast majority of the work done by the modern services industry, especially professional services.

Many have argued that soft-skills, client relations, client customizations, branding, etc. will prevent Artificial Intelligence from cannibalizing their job. But one needs to look at the way we interact with the services industry to realize the naivety of this train of thought. Booking travel tickets to ordering a meal used to consist of speaking to individuals, wherein the quality of service was a differentiator. Nowadays, all these interactions happen online and through bots, who have been fed the same script as their human counterparts. Customer complaint management has been fully automated in a number of industries, wherein customers do not even know if who they are interacting with is human or a bot! Professional services have long vaunted its role as being irreplaceable in the modern economic landscape. But developments in Artificial that Intelligence have categorically shown Artificial Intelligence is far better than humans in repetitive tasks and pattern matching. Artificial Intelligence has beaten doctors when it comes to analyzing scans and providing diagnoses. Legal drafts created by Gen AI systems rival that of even associates.

The belief that the clients need to rely on a human is fundamentally flawed. The world is fast paced and hurried; what matters is getting the job done, not who gets it done. The table by the Economist highlights the riskiness of jobs being replaced by Artificial Intelligence and automation.

The greatest thread to Chartered Accountants is not Artificial Intelligence; it's a Chartered Accountants using Artificial Intelligence.

This change must start from the examination stage itself. Our exams should no longer test whether one knows if section 112A or 112 deals with the sale of listed equities; this is a mere search away. They should test how to search for appropriate structures and the interplay amongst various aspects of tax law as well as corporate law and other bodies of law. Point solutions will be the first to fall to these systems. Cross-functional understanding is key to navigating the era of Artificial Intelligence. Your clients don't need answers; they require solutions.

The Chartered Accounts who will thrive are those that became data scientists; they amass vast pools of data and train their systems to comprehend these data lakes. They master the art of querying or prompt engineering, knowing the right question and how to ask it is as important as the answer. They will use these systems to become more efficient.

The choice for the profession is simple: either master the Artificial Intelligence system or get replaced by it. Chartered Accountancy will thrive in the era of Artificial Intelligence; the question is which Chartered Accountants will also thrive?

AI is in the name of ICAI. It needs to become part of the pedagogy and profession as well.

This includes addressing concerns about data privacy, algorithmic bias, and the potential for AI to be used in ways that could harm clients or stakeholders.

Conclusion
